As parents we sometimes underestimate how much our children are learning from us all the time. With our behaviours we are modelling for our children every day how to speak to others, how to accept a gift, how to manage our stress, how to keep ourselves clean and look after our teeth and a thousand other things. Your child is learning so many good things from you and neither you nor they are consciously aware of it most of the time. But we are all human, we have good days and bad days. There will be many days for all of us

when actually we model behaviours which we don't particularly want our children to copy. We get cross, we raise our voices, we may not be good at sharing our feelings, we might slam a door occasionally or go into a huff. In fact even when we ourselves behave badly, we can turn it into an opportunity to teach our child or young person a useful skill. Taking the time to apologise for your behaviour, explaining why you were upset and talking about what you could have done better in that situation, can be time well spent. You can help your child to understand that everyone has difficult feelings at times, that communicating about what happened can be useful and that we are capable of managing things differently the next time. This approach, of course, has to be adapted for the age and stage of development of your child. This month we are going to be thinking about beginning to teach your child some practical every day skills for independence, for better social interaction or for emotional regulation.
